



VINEYARDS

Appellation	Napa Valley
Sites	This year included the Somerston hillside vineyard, 40%; DeSantis on the valley floor just north of Zinfandel Lane, 30%; Lamoreaux in Oak Knoll, 15%; Snowden 5%; and 10% from four small parcels.
Soil	Napa Valley soils are primarily composed of broken down or decomposed rock that has been carried downhill from the eastern Vaca range and the western Mayacamas range into the base of the valley where they ultimately intermingle with the silt, clay and gravel deposits of the Napa River flood plain.
VINTAGE	
Growing Season	2008 had a warmer vintage which optimized maturity throughout the growing season. As a result, this vintage produced reds with chewier tannins and is recognized as a great vintage for the Napa Valley.

WINEMAKING	

Varietal Compositon	94% Cabernet Sauvignon, 4% Cabernet Franc, 2% Petit Verdot
Fermentation	Native-yeast and full malolactic fermentations.
Aging	Aging on the fine lees incorporates the oak so that the two years spent in 63% new barrels (a mixture of French and American) is barely noticeable. Non-filtered.
