Appellation	Napa Valley 70% Oak Knoll, 11% Alexander Valley, 10% Mount Veeder, 5% Oakville, and 4% Sonoma County
Soil	The geology and soils of Napa Valley are complex and primarily comprised of broken down or decomposed rock that has been carried downhill from the eastern Vaca range and the western Mayacamas range into the base of the valley, where they ultimately intermingle with the silt, clay and gravel deposits of the Napa River flood plain.

VINTAGE

Growing Season	The winter of 2019 was relatively mild, but record rains flooded many dormant vineyards on lower ground through March. Temperatures fluctuated April through June before evening out for a moderately warm growing season. Heat in early September gave everything a little push before a significant cooling trend slowed the pace of harvest, with extended hang time for Cabernet Sauvignon in particular. Yields were generally average.

WINEMAKING

Varietal Composition	86% Cabernet Sauvignon, 10% Merlot, and 4% Cab Franc
Fermentation	Native-yeast and malolactic fermentations
Aging	Aging sur lies with bi-monthly bâtonnage coats the tannins and integrates the wood. The 2019 vintage matured 29 months in 55% new French oak barrels (Taransaud, François Frères, & Demptos). Non-filtered
Release Date	July 2024

Our fifteenth vintage of this appellation Cabernet is blended from a combination of hillside and valley floor vineyards. Our style combines the harmony produced by traditional Bordelaise winemaking techniques with the structure gained from California's climate. – David Ramey
